A scholarship fund established through the estate of Ruth Shafer to help Perry County graduating seniors pursue advanced education.

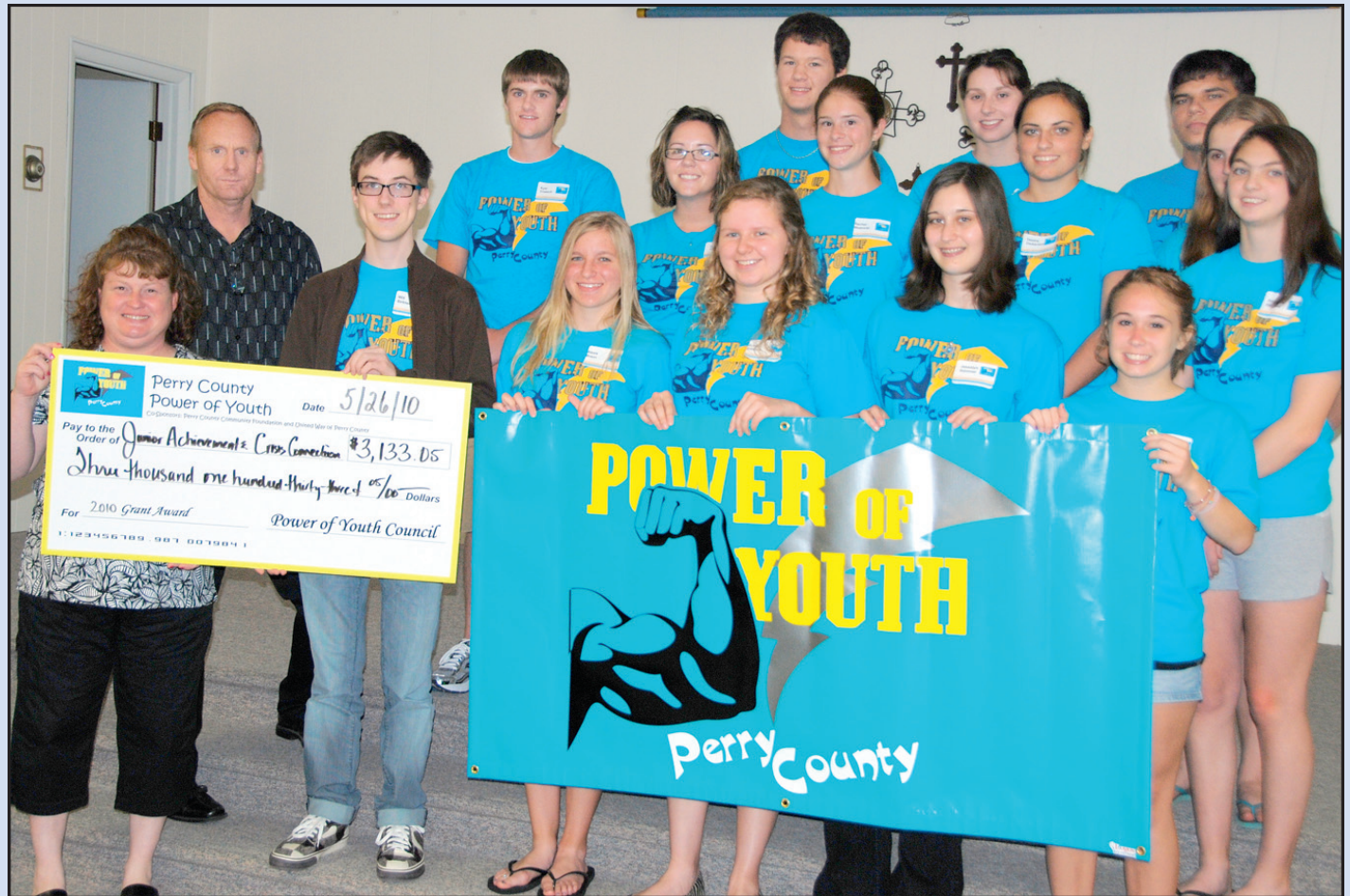
York Family Scholarship Fund

Growing Lifelong Philanthropists

The Perry County Community Foundation and United Way of Perry County have partnered to bring a new and exciting program to Perry County. The Perry County Power of Youth program promotes philanthropy among today's young people to prepare them to support their communities of tomorrow by giving their time, talent and treasure.

The Perry County Power of Youth Council consists of Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors from all three area high schools and provide them a chance to work together to improve their community. "Our mission is to develop philanthropic values in youth through education, leadership and participation in local philanthropic activities," said Sally Houzanme, Director of the Perry County Community Foundation. Engaging youth in philanthropy prepares young people to be active, lifelong community citizens.

The program is facilitated by adults from the United Way, Perry County Community Foundation, youth serving agencies and the community who will organize monthly sessions. These sessions focus on Volunteerism, Leadership Development, Marketing, and Fundraising and culminate in a grant making activity to fund a local project. The Perry County Community Foundation established a non-permanent fund to support the immediate grantmaking ability of the Youth Council and an endowed fund as a permanent resource to support the program.

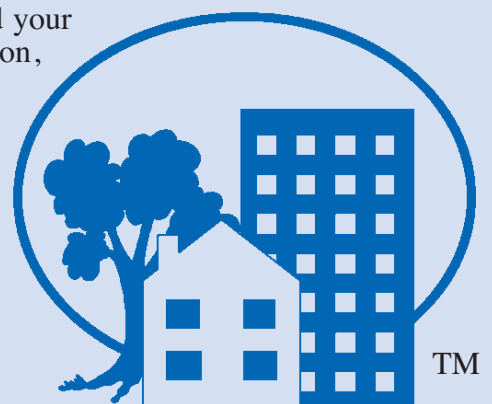
The Perry County Power of Youth Council held its "End of the Year Celebration" on May 26th. The event highlighted the Council's first year accomplishments as well as announcing grant recipients for their first year's grant cycle. The Council awarded \$3,133.05 in grants to support programs that serve youth in Perry County in grades 6-12. \$800 was awarded to Junior Achievement of Perry County to support all 8th grade students in Perry County with the JA program "Economics for Success" which focuses on career exploration and financial literacy. \$2333.05 was awarded to Crisis Connection, Inc. to support the "Natural Helpers" program at Perry Central High School and Tell City Jr. High and to provide resources to all libraries in Perry County.
